- ACDA member in England, purchased several cookbooks to sell to friends and family.


ACDA also sends a special thanks to Tina at *Olivia's Circle*. She has been instrumental in setting up displays and e-mails to improve the cookbook sales.

ACD Research Account Keeps Growing!!!!

It was so encouraging and heartwarming to recently learn that the ACD Research Account at The National Organization for Rare Disorders (NORD) was closing in on the \$35,000 required to issue a grant (\$32,900 as of August 31). One year ago, there was approximately \$13,000 in the ACD research account; so in one year, the amount has more than doubled!!! In addition to the major fundraiser in Belgium and the cookbook fundraiser by the Durand family in New York, there have been some recent contributions made to NORD that we would like to recognize.

- When Steve Lake (brother of Donna Hanson) and Jeffrey Bradley heard that the ACD research account was close to \$35,000, they sent a \$1,000 donation to NORD to help the ACDA get even closer to their goal.
- Wonderland Nursery School in Albany, New York had a bike-a-thon again this year and donated \$897.50 to NORD in memory of Olivia Durand. This was the second year that Wonderland, the preschool that Olivia's older brother, attended, raised money for ACD research. Thank you to all the children, teachers and parents who made this wonderful gesture!
- Olivia's Circle sent NORD a check for \$530 from membership donations from January to July. For each and every membership paid monthly, \$1 is donated to the ACD Restricted Research Account in Olivia's memory.

Many, many thanks to these family members and friends and to all of you who have contributed to this successful campaign to raise money for ACD research.

As most of you probably realize, it takes a lot of funding to make meaningful progress in the medical research arena. 

ACD Study Team Article Accepted for Publication

The Baylor ACD Study Team of Partha Sen, PhD, Nivedita Thakur, BA, David W. Stockton, MD, Claire Langston, MD and Bassem A. Bejjani, MD notified the ACDA that their article on the phenotype of ACD has been accepted by the *Journal of Pediatrics*. Their work to define the characteristics of ACD was supported in part by a grant from the National Institute of Health and by participation of ACDA members. Baylor projects that the article will be published later this year. Baylor has requested that the article not be published on the ADCA website since the article belongs to the *Journal of Pediatrics*; however, you can obtain a copy from us via e-mail. Baylor expressed its appreciation for all those families who have supported their research with blood and tissue samples and other information. Without ACDA member participation, this research would not be possible. 8
