Kick-off Meeting for CDC Grant

On November 14, 2008, the Steering Committee for the Centers for Disease Control grant convened its first meeting at Children's Hospital of Philadelphia. The grant, *Characterizing Alveolar Capillary Dysplasia to Increase Awareness among Health Care Providers*, was awarded to the 3 Angels Memorial Fund for ACD Research.

The objective of this grant is to develop educational materials for ACD and to determine the optimum way(s) to deliver this information to the medical community. A follow-up grant would disseminate the information to the medical practitioners. The major initiatives for the current year long project are:

- Assemble a multidisciplinary panel of experts that will serve at the Steering Committee – This has been completed and the Steering Committee members listed below will serve as the Scientific Advisory Board.
- Refine the current definition of ACD and develop diagnostic best practices
- Conduct a Scientific Workshop in Spring 2009.

The group concluded that until the gene is identified, the most accurate diagnostic procedure is to perform a lung biopsy, using a standardized protocol. Also:

- A "best practice" guideline for ACD should be published
- Experts in pulmonology, critical care and neonatology should agree on content
- Finding the gene is a top priority; therefore, samples are badly needed
- Once gene is identified, developing animal models and treatment can follow
- Only then can we begin to impact clinical practice.

We were very impressed with the mix of disciplines represented by the Steering Committee and the level of interest in ACD. We are grateful to the Committee members that have volunteered to lead this effort. We hope that some of you will be able to attend the conference scheduled for the Spring. We will let you know as soon as the date and location have been chosen.

Baylor Wins NORD Grant

In November 2008, Partha Sen, PhD, from the Baylor College of Medicine, was chosen for a second time by the National Organization for Rare Disorders (NORD) Medical Advisory Committee to receive a \$30,000 grant. While there were other applicants, Dr. Sen's study was clearly the most outstanding, according to Stefanie Putkowski, the NORD Research Program Administrator. The title of Dr. Sen's study is: Genotyping and VEGF188 Expression Study for Further Understanding of the Molecular Basis and Pathophysiology of ACD.

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
